



Aakonga at Level 2 should explore their own creativity, based on their grounding in Te Ao Haka. They innovate and experiment, exploring their own role and connections within Te Ao Haka.

This is reflected in the internals' credit values being higher than those of the externals to provide room for creativity and a safe space to develop through taking creative risks. Six credits have been allocated to both internal Achievement Standards for this reason, with the stated aim of bringing out the best in all ākonga in a 'safe' – or familiar – space.

Aakonga explore their own creativity, based on their grounding in Te Ao Haka. They innovate and experiment, exploring their own role and connections within Te Ao Haka.

### 2.1 91980 Explore elements to create a section of a Te Ao Haka item

Create part of an item text, music, choreography Identify 3 elements, purpose for them, intended effects and why. (30-60 sec)

> Examples of elements: Tempo, dynamics, Characterisation, Voice, Point of view

### 2.2 91981 Perform a Te Ao Haka item to respond to a local kaupapa.

3 key features in a performance that elevates the kaupapa through the performance

Executing a performance confidently engaging an audience

Examples of Key Features: Wiri takahi, pukani

Explore creativity based on their grounding in Te Ao Haka.

## 2.3 91982 Compare a Te Ao Haka performance and one other performance

How are 3 elements expressed in each performance, discuss the impact of the similarities and differences on the performance

> Examples of elements: Tempo, dynamics, Characterisation, Voice, Point of view

### 2.4 91983 Respond to a Te Ao Haka performance

Students will interpret the connections between a personal response as an audience and personal perspective and experiences

Consider the key features to communicate the narrative, connecting the personal response to elements.
