Explanatory Notes

- 1 *Demonstrate understanding of how music concepts are used in a music style* involves:
- describing music concepts
 - using music concepts in a music style.

Demonstrate understanding of how music concepts are significant in a music style involves:

- explaining the importance of selected music concepts in a music style
- showing how the music concepts appropriately contribute to a music style.

Demonstrate understanding of how combinations of significant music concepts contribute to a music style involves:

- discussing how combinations of music concepts enable creative and emotional expression in a music style

- applying combinations of the selected music concepts to show how they coherently contribute to a music style.
- 2 *Music concepts* are the building blocks of music. Examples of music concepts can include:
- elements of music, eg rhythm and melody
 - mātauranga Māori in music, eg whakapapa, the origins and evolution of the music that can acknowledge mana whenua, tikanga, and the behaviours and protocols in the function of music
 - conventions of music, eg notation, instrumentation.
- 3 *Music style* refers to the type of music. Examples of music style include:
- pacific reggae
 - rock or metal
 - jazz.
